The goal is to engage Missouri Baptists in prayer for the transformation of lives and communities with the gospel, according to MBC Executive Director John Yeats. "We're intentionally beginning Pray Across Missouri in a non-election year because this is not a political campaign," he said. "Rather, we want to pray for all of those who serve Missourians in the public square, and to acknowledge that God has placed men and women in authority over us to promote good and restrain evil. God's Word calls us to pray for them."

At the same time, says Yeats, "We know ultimately that lives and communities are truly transformed, not by political processes, but by the gospel of Jesus Christ. Our prayer is for a mighty movement of God in the Show Me State."
